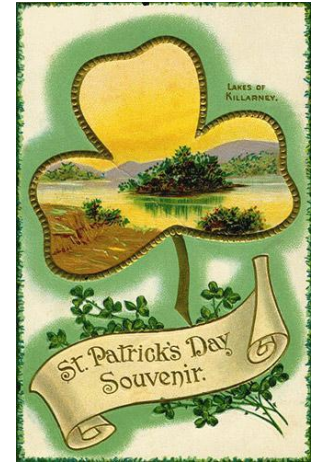

# **HALLOWEEN**



Hallowe'en, October 31 is the witchiest night of the year. It is the eve of the Festival of All Hallows, better known as All Saints. It marks the end of summer sunshine and the beginning of winter's darkness, it is supposed the arrival of hords of witches , ghosts and demons.





Hallowe'en is a holiday for children. They celebrate Hallowe'en on the 31<sup>st</sup> of October. They walk from house to house and ask "Trick or treat?" What treats do people give to children? (fruits, sweets, nuts, pudding, crackers, chocolate.) What tricks do children play on people? They pull down fences, put on spooky faces, jump and run round a house, cut pumpkin faces put on spooky costumes.

# Guy Fawkes Day.

There is also one “unusual” festival in Britain on November 5th. It is called Guy Fawkes Night.





There is also one “unusual” festival in Britain on November 5<sup>th</sup>. It is called Guy Fawkes Night. On November 5<sup>th</sup>, 1605 Guy Fawkes organized a plot of Roman Catholics who tried to blow up the Houses of Parliament to kill King James 1 and to seize power [захватить власть]. But the plot was disclosed. Guy Fawkes was arrested, tortured and hanged. The plot is still commemorated by the burning of Guy’s effigy (чучело) and the explosion of fireworks every November 5<sup>th</sup>. The children of England every year make “guys” of straw and old clothes and burn them on bonfires on that day.

I'll make a huge bonfire!

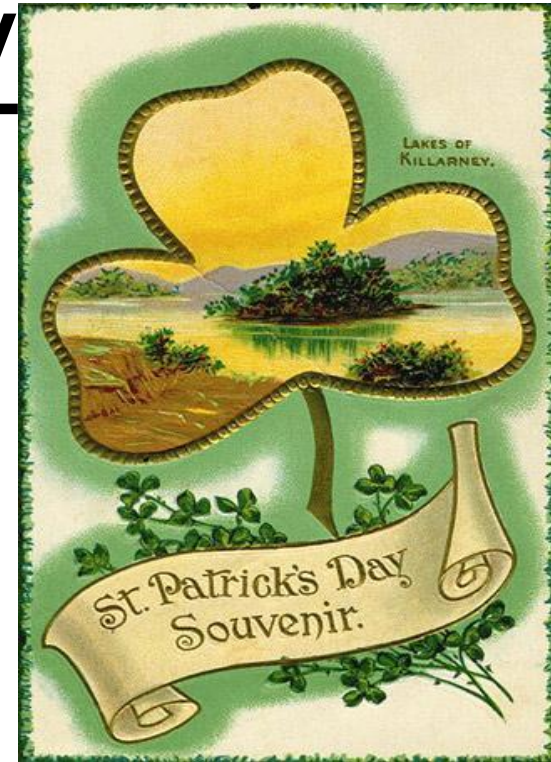
